## Healthy Hints from our Congregational Health Team

**Liquid potpourri can harm your pet.** Filling your house with the smell of pine or peppermint may seem inviting, but if you're partial to heating your scented oil in a simmer pot, know that it can cause serious harm to your cat. These oils are toxic to cats, and even a few licks can result in severe chemical burns in the mouth, fever, difficulty breathing, and tremors (shakes). Dogs aren't quite as sensitive, but it's still wise to scent your home with a non-toxic candle kept safely out of your pet's reach.

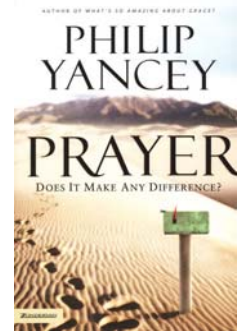


One of the first things we learn to do as Christians is pray. We pray for a relationship with God; for forgiveness of our sins; for protection from evil; for our friends, family, and others; for those who don't know God; for world leaders; for thanksgiving and praise; for direction, wisdom, and knowledge; for God's provision. But we have a problem. It's not totally real for many of us. We don't engage in regular, intentional prayer. We don't fully understand what we're doing. Yet prayer is the single, greatest factor in establishing and maintaining a close personal relationship with God and more fully realizing God's promises to us.

Prayer prepares us for the events of life and keeps us going during difficult times. It changes us individually and transforms us collectively into the Body of Christ fulfilling God's plan. It helps us better understand what keeps us from experiencing God's blessings and his promised new way of living.

**During 2010 our focus at Hempfield COB is "Lord, Teach Us to Pray."** In an effort to have each member of our congregation better understand it and realize its full benefits, prayer will be the focus of our sermons series, our worship experience, and many educational activities.

**During January and February, we will be examining Philip Yancey's book, "Prayer: Does It Make Any Difference?"** in a six-week workshop, using a study guide and DVD that accompany the book. Galen Brumbaugh will hold sessions **Tuesday mornings from 10:30-12:00 noon starting on January 5<sup>th</sup>**. Pastor Kent will conduct sessions **Thursday evenings from 7:00-8:30 starting on January 7<sup>th</sup>**. Pastor John will conduct sessions on **Saturday mornings from 8:30-10:00 starting on January 9<sup>th</sup>**. Pastor Geoff and other small group leaders will use their small group sessions to facilitate this study. The Pastors are asking each of you to make this six-week commitment on behalf of your improved spiritual well-being and the great work that God has in mind for Hempfield. More specific information will follow.

# Growing Projects



How can we begin to thank our four farmers, Jim Kettering, Jim Musser, Lowell Landis, and Dick Harnish for their participation in this

fabulous ministry! This year they have devoted approximately 13 acres of crops (corn and soybeans) to go toward this ministry. Because of their dedication and generosity, plus a few additional gifts, the Hempfield Church will send almost \$10,000 to the Foods Resource Bank to be directed to a Church of the Brethren ministry project in the Dominican Republic.

This ministry in the Dominican is a powerful life changing experience for Dominican and Haitian families who participate. See below for a more detailed explanation and report on this ministry. What a joy to be a part of this life transforming ministry!!

**Name:** Food Security for the Poor in Eastern and Southern Dominican Republic

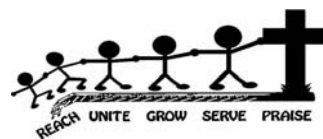
**Goal:** The goal of this project is to reduce malnutrition and increase family incomes of Haitian immigrants and Dominicans of Haitian descent to improve their overall quality of life. The project will work with 770 families in 32 poor rural communities, and will also provide basic follow-up for processes already started in 17 communities. The project aims to:

- Increase and diversify family food production by increasing access to productive land, improving cultivation techniques, and creating a seed bank.
- Increase family incomes with improved marketing of agricultural production and micro-enterprises.
- Improve the quality of education for children and adults by opening pre-schools and adult literacy programs.
- Increase respect for human, economic, civil, social and cultural rights of the participating communities by strengthening their local organizations.

**Project partners:** SSID is working closely with the Group of Interdenominational Pastors (GPI), an organization of Haitian pastors of various Christian denominations who reside in the DR, and the Church of the Brothers (Iglesia de los Hermanos), which works with poor communities including Haitian-Dominicans in several areas in the country. SSID also has relationships with local and national government agencies including those responsible for access to the lands in question.

**During the first three months of this project:** SSID, GPI and Church of the Brothers first worked to select the new families, present the project to the new communities and families, and to the local representatives of the Ministry of Agriculture. They also visited farmers on their land to provide support for new crops and land management. They conducted workshops and demonstrations to strengthen production techniques and local seed banks, and meetings to shore up local community organizing for collective problem solving. Families also implemented a system called “Convite” in which the community comes together to do the necessary work on a neighbor’s land when that person or family is sick or has some other problem. This practice strengthens solidarity, unity and cooperation. As planned, the project also provided initial training on human relationships and domestic violence.
