

Healthy Hints from our Congregational Health Team

New Rule for Spotting Skin Cancer Current guidelines used to detect abnormal moles state that people should look for moles only greater than 6 mm (larger than a pencil eraser). "But size is increasingly arbitrary and irrelevant," says researcher Stuart Goldsmith, MD. One study estimates that 22% (more than $1/5^{th}$) of invasive melanomas are less than 5 mm – so don't overlook smaller moles that appear abnormal (dark colored, with irregular borders).
