Its purpose is to provide over 400 low income families food to bridge the gap between school lunch on Friday and school breakfast on Monday. Power Packs include ingredients and a recipe for a full meal and staples. Those attending will be asked to bring an item of food—peanut butter in plastic jars, canned peaches or pears (15 oz.), spaghetti sauce in cans or plastic jars (26 oz.), canned tuna (12 oz.), canned carrots (15 oz.), or baked beans (15 oz.). Our program will be “All about You”—an interactive program to help you get to know each other better.

Healthy Hints from our Congregational Health Team

When you take a calcium supplement, it's the amount of **elemental** calcium that's key. For example, Tums Ultra 1000 contains 1000 mg. of calcium carbonate per tablet, but **only 40% of** calcium carbonate **is elemental calcium**.
