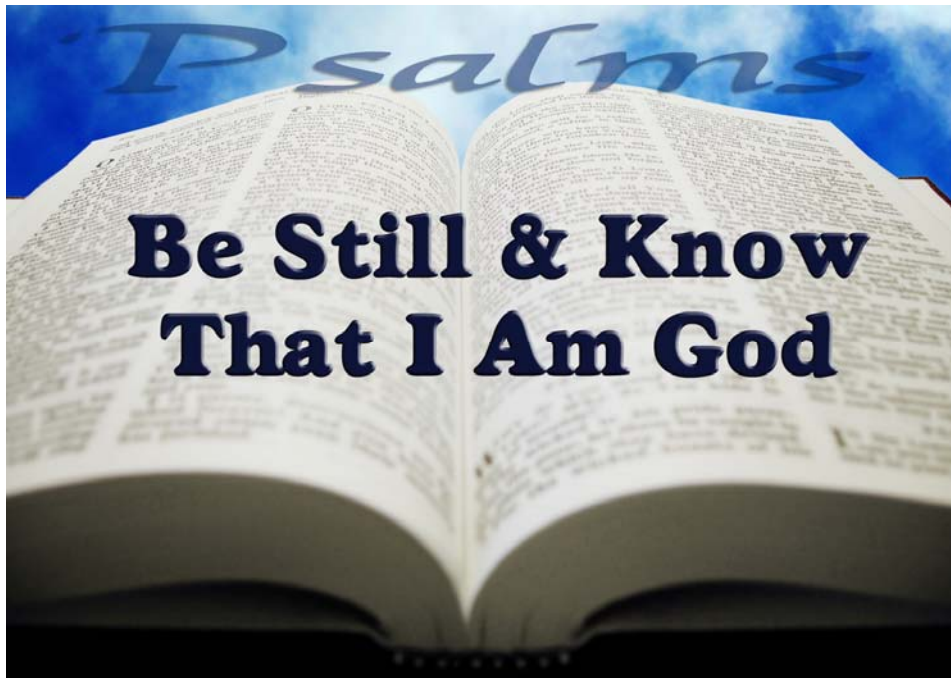

- † **Please sign the guest register** when it passes by you (your name, address & phone number, please) so that we can let you know how much we appreciate your visit with us today.

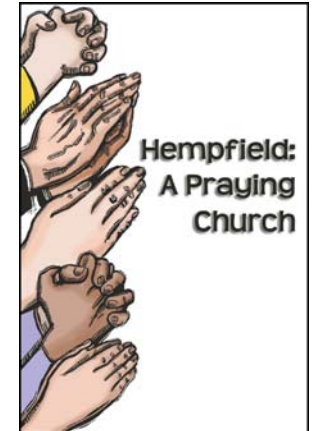

Healthy Hints from our Congregational Health Team

Salt for athlete's foot? A saline [salt] solution provides a hostile environment for fungus, decreases excess perspiration, and softens skin so antifungal meds can penetrate deeper. Soak your foot for 10-15 minutes in a mixture of 2 teaspoons of salt per pint of warm water, recommends podiatric surgeon Suzanne M Levine, DPM. (*Prevention*, April 2010, pg. 49)

In June...

Ray Hutchison will be teaching a series called "Stand Firm and Pray Hard" with Ephesians 6:10-20 as the theme passage. The teaching will focus on spiritual warfare ("Stand Firm") the first two weeks and prayer ("Pray Hard") the last two weeks. We will see how the necessity for prayer grows out of the reality of spiritual warfare.

† **June 6 - "You are in a Battle"**

This lesson will focus on identifying Satan, our spiritual enemy, and the typical tactics (or schemes) he uses against us.

† **June 13 - "Put on Your Protection"**

This lesson will concentrate on the protections God has given us and provide some practical suggestions for standing firm in the face of Satan's opposition.

† **June 20 - "Understand Your Prayer Resources"**

Lesson four will focus on the various kinds of prayer using the acronym ACTS (Adoration, Confession, Thanksgiving and Supplication) as our guide.

† **June 27 - "Engage in Powerful and Effective Prayer"**

This final lesson will serve as an introduction to the "Scripture Prayer Guide"—a powerful and practical prayer tool that is available to everyone over the Internet.

Each lesson will be very practical with things to take home to help each person "Stand Firm and Pray Hard."

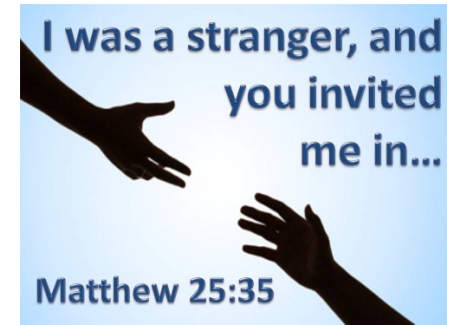
