THE 34TH BRETHERN DISASTER RELIEF AUCTION held September 24-25 raised \$425,000. There were 1,000 registered bidders and 13 auctioneers conducted the sale. Highlights included a walnut marble roller tower by Hiram Minnich, \$6,800; a Haiti rebuilding project, \$50,000; a heifer auction, \$48,000; a quilt auction, \$37,000; food, \$34,000; share-a-meal, \$10,000; a theme-basket auction, \$15,000; a coin auction, \$9,000; produce, \$13,000; baked goods, \$13,000 and Amish doughnuts and pretzels, \$6,000.
