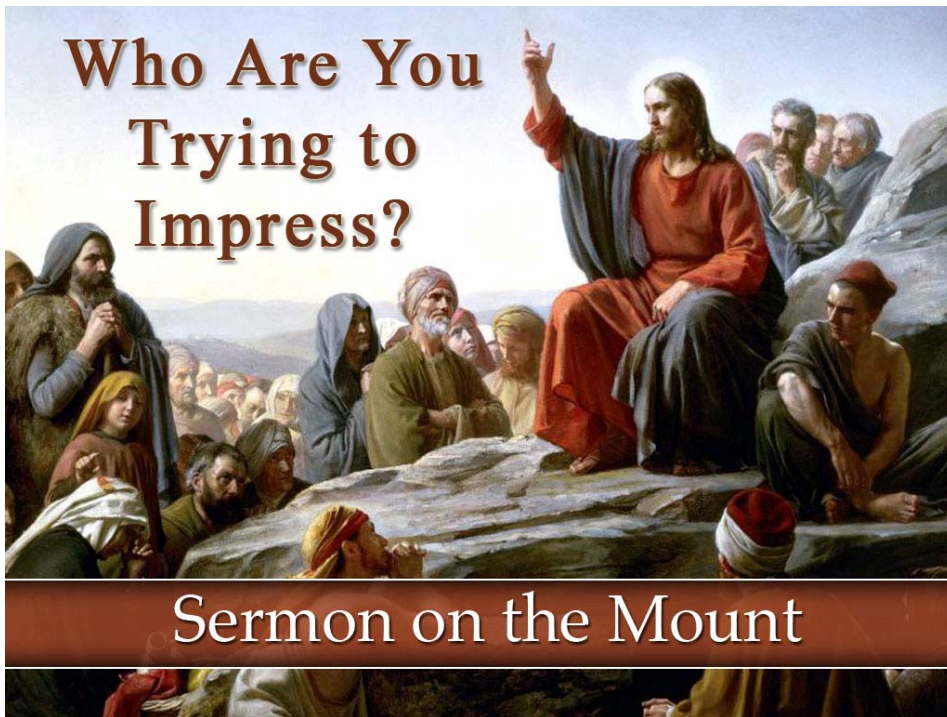

Healthy Hints from our Congregational Health Team

Strawberry Bliss—Luscious, heavenly scented, and red all the way through, these are the signs of a strawberry picked at its peak. This fruit doesn't continue to ripen after picking. Choose deeply colored berries and avoid mushy ones. Consider buying organic.

Strawberries retain a high level of pesticide residue. Chill whole, unwashed berries in a single layer, loosely covered. Just before using, rinse gently in a bowl of cold water – not under the tap) and dry on paper towels (wet berries spoil faster). Then enjoy!

Strawberries are rich in anti-oxidants and, ounce for ounce, have more vitamin C than oranges.
