Healthy Hints from our Congregational Health Team

How can you know which toothbrush features are hype and which can really help keep your smile healthy? Straight from the dental experts' mouths, here's what you need:

- **A powerful front tip** – A concentrated bunch of bristles helps scrub away residue in tight crevices.
- **Crisscross bristles** – Rows slanting in different directions let you clean on push and pull motions.
- **Indicator bristles** – These have a nontoxic dye to give you a heads-up when it's time for a new brush.
- **Flexible head** – A bit of give helps the brush adjust better to the shape of your mouth.
- **Ergonomic handle** – A comfy grip defeats fatigue, so you brush longer.
