

Ladies Spring Bible Study

For the Spring 2019 Ladies Bible Study we will be using the five sessions DVD Bible Study “Anxious for Nothing – Finding Calm in a Chaotic World” by Max Lucado.



In this five-session video Bible study, Max Lucado explores God’s promise in Philippians 4:4–8 and shows that while anxiety is part of life, it doesn’t have to dominate life.
