I'm Lookiting!

"As Thou wilt, what Thou wilt, when thou Wilt." – Thomas à Kempis

There was a Peanuts cartoon strip back in the day in which Lucy was engaged in various playground activities and she kept calling out, "Lookit, Charlie Brown—lookit!" He was doing his best to ignore her but finally exploded and screamed, "I'M LOOKITING!"

It seems that we act like Lucy sometimes where God is concerned. During those times in which we perceive that we're being "good," we say, "Lookit, lookit!" Maybe it's during Sunday morning or while we're helping someone during the week—we want God the Parent to acknowledge what we're doing and approve.

Then there are the times during which we'd prefer *no one* was "lookiting." And it's not just while we're sinning, it's just...when we're being ourselves. It's when our human nature has assumed control, like the dominant personality that comes to the surface from within someone who suffers from dissociative identity disorder.

Like the priests of Baal, we seem under the impression that God is paying attention sometimes and at other times is off roaming the cosmos. Elijah had a few things to say about that!

Our God is *always* lookiting. He loves when we present ourselves before him on Sunday morning, but how do you think He feels when we put up the "No Vacancy" sign the rest of the week? All God asks is that we open ourselves and connect with him. Jeremiah 29:13 says, "You will seek me and find me when you seek me with all your heart." If you exercised one day a week and took six days off, well...the results would be marginal at best. In creation, God did the exact opposite of that for us. Now all He wants is to take joy in His children.

God will ask a lot of us this year. It's nothing more than we can handle unless we try to do it all by ourselves. In Him we find all the power we will need...and more.



Prayer 2013 - Don't face the Cliff without it

As I'm writing this, our country is facing the fiscal cliff as we brace ourselves for what the future holds while being held in the grip of the unknown. In a book I'm reading, there's a story about a missionary who took a small plane bound for a remote jungle village. The plane was designed to hold four people and very limited luggage, but the pilot didn't seem to

understand that fact and crammed the luggage compartment until it began to intrude upon the passenger space. In the back seat, built for two, he put three big men and a woman sat in the front with him so there were 5 passengers (too many passengers, way too much luggage). To top it all off, the runway sat in a bowl-like valley, with mountains on all sides of it.

As the Cessna started down the strip, it seemed the pilot couldn't get it off the ground. As they raced toward the mountain, the pilot broke out in a cold sweat. Under his breath the missionary prayed. "God if this plane doesn't go up you don't go up either" which meant he knew God was with him, so he could relax. As it turned out, without even a foot to spare, the plane became airborne, then banked around sharply to avoid the mountain. They were safe – for the moment at least.

It had been raining at the crude village airstrip when they arrived and the runway was very muddy. Nevertheless the pilot decided to attempt a landing. Instead of moving straight ahead after the tires had hit the runway, the plane drifted to the left and they were moving down the muddy runway sideways. The pilot was powerless to gain control of the aircraft or to apply the brakes to slow its forward motion. It soon became apparent that they needed a miracle, for the runway ended at the edge of a two-hundred foot cliff. The miracle came just in time with only a small piece of real estate between them and eternity.

This is our God, able to intervene as we careen toward a cliff of any kind, be it physical, emotional, financial, etc. We may not feel secure in the decisions our government makes in regards to the fiscal cliff, but we can always, always know this....**NOTHING** is impossible with our God when we ask Him for a safe landing. 1 Thessalonians 5:17 – Pray continually
