Just a little history...I have known Fred since my second year in seminary when he became my mentor and eventually close brother in Christ at Oakland Church of the Brethren in Ohio. He has written many books on hospitality, the first being "Widening the Welcome of Your Church."

Jesus showed love to all people. He came and tore down the social barriers that kept people from loving each other. He treated every person He met as if they were the most important person in the world. And for Jesus, each person is. Maybe simply put, **Hospitality is seeing every person as an opportunity to share the love of Jesus.** That affects all that we do, personally and as the church. **The church must be a safe place for people to come.** And it is us who must make it that. And we only know how well we do when someone very different from us walks into those doors.

Jesus welcomed everyone right where they were in life. The Bible tells us that Jesus came to us, the world, while we were yet sinners, enemies of God. God is love and has opened His love to all people in Christ that we all be welcomed in to His presence. And so for us as the Church, everything we do here needs to foster that. Every detail of every ministry, from the moment someone drives into the parking lot, to how they're greeted and everything that happens in between—every detail must be about striving to make all people feel welcome, like we truly want them here. Because we do.

"Do not be afraid--for I Myself will help you--declares the Lord, your Redeemer, the Holy One of Israel." --Isaiah 41:14

Yesterday morning my day didn't start so well—it was a continuation of the night before, which had become the day of, and I showed up at HCOB not ready to do much of anything useful. I felt like a 4th-generation photocopy of myself! So I stopped by Amy's office and asked her if she had any encouraging words. She reads the same Spurgeon devotional that I do, so she paused for a minute and asked if I had read it that morning.

This morning, let us hear the Lord Jesus speak to each one of us:

"I Myself will help you. It is but a small thing for Me, your God, to help you. Consider what I have done already. What! not help you? Why, I bought you with My blood. What! Not help you? Why, I have died for you! And if I have done the greater--will I not do the lesser? Help you? Before the world began--I chose you. I laid aside My glory and became a man for you. I gave up My life for you! And if I did all this--I will surely help you now. If you had need of a thousand times as much help--I would give it to you. You require little, compared with what I am ready to give. It is much for you to need-but it is nothing for Me to bestow.

What! Not help you? Fear not! If there were an ant at the door of your granary, asking for help--it would not ruin you to give him a handful of your wheat! Just so, you are nothing but a tiny insect at the door of My all-sufficiency!"

"I Myself will help you!" O my soul, is not this enough? Bring your empty pitcher here! Surely this well will fill it. Hasten! Gather up your needs, and bring them here--your emptiness, your woes, your troubles. Behold, this river of God is full for your supply. What more can you desire? The Eternal God is your helper! – C.H. Spurgeon

Pretty awesome. But how quickly we lose perspective! It's not that the problems we face aren't a big deal, because they do feel like that. For me, it's a little too much of the "Sunday school answer" to say, "I shouldn't worry about anything or get stressed because look at what Jesus had to endure—my problems are nothing in comparison." While that is certainly true, the reality is that we do get stressed and worried sometimes, no matter how mature in our faith we are or think that we are. We fail to seek shelter soon enough when we see the storm coming.

We need to constantly remind ourselves that God desires so deeply to help us. Psalm 46:1 says "God is our refuge and strength, an ever-present help in trouble." I loved the image of myself as an ant—it's certainly no great effort, inconvenience, or expense for God to hand me a few kernels of wheat. All I have to do is knock on the door and ask! Not too complicated when you think about it. Only my flawed perspective and pride stand in the way. Go, little ant, go! There are a million ants like you, but for some reason each one is special to God. Go, little ant, go! Jesus has something for you.




Committed to...What?—Acts 2:42-47


