Pastor Pete Kontra The Blue Marble

In an article for *Decision* magazine, Samuel Kamaleson illustrates the difficulty of submission through a Christian folk story from South India. There are several versions of it, but here it opens with a young boy who loved to play marbles. He regularly walked through his neighborhood with a pocketful of his best marbles, hoping to find opponents to play against. One marble in particular, his special blue marble, had won him many matches.

During one walk he encountered a young girl who was eating a bag of chocolate candy. Though the boy's first love was marbles, he had a weakness for chocolates. As he stood there interacting with the young girl, his salivary glands and the rumbling in his stomach became uncontrollable, and he thought to himself, *I have got to get my hands on those chocolates*.

Concocting a plan, he asked the girl, "How about I give you all these marbles for those chocolates?" She replied, "Sounds fair to me."

He put his hand in his pocket, searching for the distinguishing cracks on the surface of the blue marble. Once he identified the blue marble with his finger tip, he carefully pushed it to the bottom of his pocket and pulled out all the other marbles.

As he handed the marbles to the girl in exchange for the chocolate, the boy thought his plan was a success and turned to walk away. As he began to eat the candy, he suddenly turned to the girl and asked, "Hey, did you give me *all* the chocolates?"

Our human nature wants to do the same as the boy in this story. We want everything the Kingdom of God has to offer. We want to have a secure sense of God's presence, we want all our prayers to be answered, we want to "feel close" to Jesus, we want to flourish in the riches of God's glory—we want it all. But often we are unwilling to give up everything for it. Many times there is a "blue marble" in our lives that we seem unwilling to offer to the control of Christ. Until we can fully subjugate ourselves to God's will, our participation in God's kingdom will be limited.

What blue marble are you holding onto? What about for us as the church?

In Luke 9:23 Jesus says, "If anyone would come after me, he must deny himself and take up his cross daily and follow me."

God is leading us into the world to make more disciples of Christ. It's time for us to empty our pockets and hold nothing back as we follow. Pray with me that it would be so by the grace of our Lord.

Grains of Rice

"In studying any attribute, the essential oneness of all the attributes soon becomes apparent. We see, for instance, that if God is self-existent He must be also self-sufficient; and if He has power He, being infinite, must have all power. If He possesses knowledge, His infinitude assures us that He possesses all knowledge. Similarly, His immutability presupposes His faithfulness. If He is unchanging, it follows that He could not be unfaithful since that would require Him to change. Any failure within the divine character would argue imperfection and because God is perfect, it could not occur. Thus, the attributes explain each other and prove that they are but glimpses the mind enjoys of the absolutely perfect Godhead.

All of God's acts are consistent with all of His attributes. No attribute contradicts any other, but all harmonize and blend into each other in the infinite abyss of the Godhead. All that God does agrees with all that God is, and being and doing are one in Him. The familiar picture of God as often torn between His justice and His mercy is altogether false to the facts. To think of God as inclining first toward one and then toward another of His attributes is to imagine a God who is unsure of Himself, frustrated and emotionally unstable, which of course is to say that the one of whom we are thinking is not the true God at all but a weak, mental reflection of Him badly out of focus."

As inconsistent, conflicted people we can't help but project some of ourselves onto the absolutely perfect Godhead. We know this is backwards, that we are created in His image not vice versa, but we keep on doing it. I wonder how much of our faith suffers because the God we believe in is full of our own inadequacies? Perfection is indeed impossible for us to even imagine. So what do we do?

Something I've been learning is to look for *moments*. Moments where God connects to us through his Holy Spirit and there's a thought, an emotion, a clarity, a desire, etc. that "comes out of nowhere" yet seems to be the only thing that makes sense. Sometimes the Spirit even takes the time to do nothing more than encourage after a big spiritual encounter. It's awesome

Listen, pray and prepare yourself for your next encounter. We might not be able to fully grasp the perfection of God, but we can be intentional about not making him less than perfect in our own eyes. And we can wait with anticipation for those moments when He demonstrates His love for us—a love that is...perfect!

Luke's account of the cost of following Jesus has three fascinating encounters with those who were 'in the crowd', but had not taken the bold steps to become disciples, as the 12 had done. Jesus looks this guy in the face and says the exact same thing to him that he said to Peter, Andrew, James, John, and Matthew: "Follow me." They responded by immediately answering the call and leaving everything else. His response: "There's something I have to do before I can follow you." What would you have done – what do you do – in that same situation? How many of us, when confronted with the stark, hard choice that Jesus gives – to follow him or something else – choose him?


