L.I.F.E.

One of the things in this world that can be the most difficult to enjoy is exactly what God has given to us as a beautiful gift—LIFE. Many of us know what I mean when I talk about all the distractions, fears, responsibilities, and clutter which get in the way of our living life to the fullest. We know those exist, so I want to offer a way through all of that, the most excellent way, the way of true LIFE. Here is a simple way to remind ourselves of why we are here in this world. It reads:

- L.--Living a new abundant life.
- I.--Intended mission, given by Christ.
- **F**.--Full authority from the Holy Spirit for the mission.
- **E**.--Executing God's will.
- **L.** It all starts by **LIVING**. In John 10:10 Jesus says, "I have come that they may have life, and have it abundantly." God has offered to us, through His Son Jesus Christ, new life. And as an added bonus He says He gives us ABUNDANT life, life to the fullest, to the max, the most we can ever receive. Believe God's promise. Stop living bankrupt in joy and love and start living abundantly in Christ. This is no empty promise, but one that God has made to us in utmost love for His children.
- **I.** We live abundantly in Christ, which means we live for Christ, which is to live for others, making disciples of all people. That is our **Intended Mission**, given by Christ in the Great Commission (Matthew 28:19), and we fulfill it by pouring out our abundant living upon all people around us.
- **F.** How can we live abundantly and fulfill the Great Commission when we are merely humans? In Matthew 28:18, Jesus says, "ALL AUTHORITY in heaven and on earth has been given to me." "Therefore", He says, "go..." Jesus makes it clear that God has given Him all power, all authority, all He needs to do all things. That includes you and me. As we live abundantly in Jesus Christ, part of our living includes receiving this power and love from Christ, so that we do not attempt to fulfill our mission all alone, but do it through the **Full Authority** given to us through the Holy Spirit. In Christ we really can do all things.
- **E.** Finally, the day-to-day abundant living, fulfilling our intended mission, and experiencing the full authority of the Holy Spirit is all done through **Executing God's Will** for our lives. We must at all times be in prayer, communicating with God, finding out what He wants us to do in each situation. We must read the Scriptures, study them, and listen to what they are telling us for our lives. We must be a part of a faith community, to build each other up and keep each other on track. Listen to what God's will is for your life, then execute it to your best ability.

LIFE. It is a wonderful thing. That is, only when we give ourselves over to the One Who created it. May it be so for you by the grace of God. -Pastor Pete

It would be unthinkable for me to sin against the LORD by failing to pray for you – 1 Sam 12:23.

AND VBS!!!



This is the time of year when Camp Swatara starts to come alive. This beautiful oasis, founded in 1943 by the Church of the Brethren, sits at the foot of Blue Mountain in northwestern Berks County. The Camp is an outdoor ministry facility that provides opportunities for people of all ages to grow in their relationship with Jesus Christ. Nature, the visible sign of God's love for all, provides a perfect setting to deepen, renew or begin a walk with Christ.

Hempfield COB supports Camp Swatara is several different ways. We provide financial support, our youth volunteer as counselors, Jason Haldeman actively participates as the full-time Program Coordinator for a number of the camp's programs, and our members participate in Camp fundraisers.

Camp kicked off in April with volunteers coming to open up the hiking trails by checking blazes, clearing branches and identifying any other needs. April was also the opening of the Family Camping Center for the 2016 season. Camp Swatara offers a great weekend getaway for families to grow closer by spending time away from video games and having fun together in nature.

The Camp offers an amazing array of specialty camps for kids in grades 2 through 12. To name just a few - for kids with an interest in Science, Technology, Engineering and math there is a camp for you; for creative kids there is a Creative Arts camp; for kids who love music, there is a music camp. Then there is a Girl Power week to help build self-esteem for girls in grades 3-5. Kids that are into extreme adventures can go to Adirondack camp and enjoy hiking, mountain biking, canoeing, and white water rafting.
